It was announced that our "Chief of the Clan", Rev. Joe Frank Barton of Albany, Georgia was in the hospital. A motion was made and seconded to send flowers to him from the "Reunion Family".

James E. Barton, Nominating Committee Chairman presented the following slate of Officers for the 1981 Reunion:

Miss Lois West, Registration Chairman, reported 88 persons registered. These include 19 from N.C., 9 from Texas, 4 from Georgia, 1 from Kentucky, 1 from Indiana and the balance from S.C. She also announced that she has prints of the Kindness Barton tintype if anyone is interested.

The Memorial Service was then conducted by Glenn Y. Barton. After announcing the date for the next reunion, the second Sunday in August of 1981, the "Family Meeting" concluded with the congregational singing of "Bless Be The Tie That Binds" while holding hands in a circle around the fellowship hall.
